120 W. Moore St. Captain Newton's B&B , Lisa & Hugh Fosbury

Settled on one of the original one hundred lots laid out by the city founders, this home has been part of Southport since 1886. Built by Captain Walker Newton (a renowned river pilot of his time) and updated since, the history and the legacy that remain will remind you of a Victorian past and present day find.

207 N. Lord St B.F. Newton House , Sherol Lappala

According to the The Architecture of Southport by Carl Lounsbury the B.F. Newton House at 207 N. Lord St. was moved 25 feet south to its current location in September 1891 to make room for the newer house next door. Throughout the late

19th century the home was rented to numerous river pilots. In 2013 Sherol Lappala conducted a complete renovation of the home and garden.



112 W. Nash St. C.C. Morse Cottage ca 1873, Norma Suggs

Originally a four-room cottage, this house has had several additions, while keeping the flavor of an old Southport residence. Much of the house is original, including the chimney, as well as most of the interior doors and door facings. Restored in its original style, the low ceilings, hardwood floors, and antiques used throughout are all reminiscent of a time long past.





306 Marina View Dr Mermaid Cottage, Ashley Kincaide

This 3 bedroom home was built in 2005 & sports a Mermaid statue that greets you on the front steps. Mermaids abound in this delightful home; appearing in the kitchen, living room, bedroom and bathroom. The owner has painted and distressed pieces & displays them throughout the home as well. All of these touches creates a warm & inviting oasis from the world.



119 North Lord Street Robert Ruark Inn, Linda & Rick Pukenas

Built in 1890 and remodeled by Jeff Ward in 2008, the Ruark house has machine-sawn brackets beneath the cornice. Lancet windows are surrounded by round-edge shingles in the gables. Southport bows are evident in the doors and windows. Author Robert Ruark was the grandson of the

builder. His book *Old Man and the Boy* recalls his childhood here.



304 E. Leonard St.

This must-see home is a 1958 ranch with additions/ renovations completed in 2010. Front & back porches were added as well as a driveway, parking pad and outdoor shower. The kitchen has a modern "1950's chic", look and feel. There is a retro look & feel that continues throughout this delightful cottage. The house includes an art studio which doubles as a 2nd bedroom. Whimsical bursts of color and art can be found throughout the home. Look for "homemade wallpaper" and mosaic artwork among all the treasures to see.



310 College Street Vickie Pelfrey

This charming cottage was built in 1916 & may have been relocated to its present site. There are original floors in the front 2 rooms. Over the years, a front porch, M-bedroom, Carolina room and 4 seasons back porch have been added. The attic has been renovated to include a bedroom, walk-in closet & 1/2 bath. The owner has used original cabinets & reclaimed doors throughout. Bold colors & an eclectic style abound, with vintage & collectable shoes to admire. The out-

side living area, complete with statues is a haven for relaxing & enjoyment. The cottage radiates with charm & style & invites you to linger.
